

# The Origin of RELIGIOUS MISUNDERSTANDING AND FALSE TEACHING

Aren't you somewhat amazed and startled by what you see? Where did all these denominations, traditions, and isms come from? One who is an honest and sincere student of the Scriptures knows that something is amiss, and he must confess that there are many, many denominations and doctrines in divergence with the Bible. Surely this is not what the Lord prayed for in the 17th chapter of John (John 17:20-22). Surely this is not the will of the Lord who through the inspired apostle Paul stressed the oneness of His plan (Ephesians 4:3-6), and showed the sinfulness of division and the party spirit (I Corinthians 1:10-13; 3:3,4,17; Romans 16:17).

Just exactly what are the origins of religious misunderstanding and teachings foreign to the Word of God?

We do not claim to have all the answers, nor is our position altogether an arbitrary one. 

source of misunderstanding, false teaching, and erroneous practice. The Roman Catholic Church, with her sister bodies and offspring, came into being as a direct fulfillment of inspired prophecy (II Thessalonians 2:1-8; I Tim. 4:1-3; II Timothy 4:1-4; etc.). The falling away from the faith and the original church came as an admixture of Judaism, paganism, and human philosophy with a sprinkling of Christianity. This finally crystalized into the Catholic politico-religious system (the Eastern Church being very similar).

The Protestant Reformation was an effort to reform some of this apostasy, but Protestantism has carried over some of the teaching and thinking of Catholicism (and it seems today in many denominations to be headed back toward Rome). Sprinkling for baptism, as well as "infant" baptism, came out of Catholicism; also, the use of human traditions and creeds to suppliment and replace the Bible, systems of church government unheard of in the New Testament, the distinction of clergy and laity, unwarranted titles of religious leaders such as "Holy Father" and "Reverend," observance of Holy days—to name a few of the carry-over doctrines from Catholicism.

#### THE PROTESTANT REFORMATION

The Protestant Reformation first began within the Catholic Church, but the Reformers were soon compelled to leave this system. They exposed many evils of Catholicism, but (sad to say) they were greatly reactionary. In the heat of theological battle in the midst of, and on the fringe of, the Dark Ages it was hard for them to sit back and view everything objectively. The pendulum swung to the other extreme, and with time their reactionary views were crystalized and canonized into creeds; hence a snare for unborn generations to perpetuate denominationalism by being loyal to their respective man-made creeds.

Let us elaborate. In the Catholic Church the Reformers found God dethroned with the Pope and priests in His place. They saw men attempting to be justified by prescribed human works. Faith seemed to be left out of the picture. Trying to correct such erroneous religion, the

reactionary Reformers were the unintended cause of other misunderstandings which were equally wrong. They went to the extreme in the other direction. They stressed the sovereignty of God to the point of complete predestination, with "once in grace always in grace" being the natural offshot. The favorite and most characteristic doctrine of Protestantism became "FAITH ONLY" and still is today. Martin Luther reportedly called the epistle of James an epistle of "straw" (denying it was part of the Bible) because it ran counter to his theory of "faith only." (James teaches that we are not saved by "faith only") Other reactionary teachings came later, but took more of a localized character in various denominations.

#### **DELUDED DECEIVERS**

We call this group "deluded deceivers" since the Bible does mention "deceiving and being deceived." All false teaching comes as a result of deception one way or another, but we are aptly applying this to the sects and cults of more recent times.

Men and women have "arisen" claiming the gift of inspiration or prophecy, and even claiming that angels have given them lost books of religion (Galatians 1:8). It is amazing how many people constitute such denominations today. But these people usually have a fierce (but not rational) loyalty to their religion and its founder. Thus, they are overtly joined in unholy wedlock to teachings other than the HOLY Scriptures, and arranging a separation is most difficult because of their deluded sense of loyalty.

These people need to realize that the gift of prophecy is not in the church today (I Corinthians 13:8-10; Eph. 3:3-5; 2:20), and the Word of God is not to be added to (Revelation 22:18). The man who claims the Holy Spirit tells him what to preach without studying is deluded indeed (He equates himself with an apostle or prophet). Feeling without fact in religion is delusion. After all, a man who must rely altogether on his feelings (in the everyday physical world) is a blind man and cannot see. But by the truth of God we can KNOW through faith.

#### MODERN LIBERALISM

This past century saw the beginning in a large way (Continued on Next Page)

of Modern Liberalism (this liberalism is very radical). It is a swing away from historic Christianity and the authenticity of the Bible itself in the name of "Higher Learning." The supernatural, if not denied outright, is down-graded. This school of religious thought (which has cut across party lines of old-line denominations) is obsessed with the theory of evolution in reference to the origin of life, and it is applied to the Bible in almost every sense (as well as to man and society in general). Naturally the inspiration of the Scriptures is not held in the usual historical sense. These pseudo-religionists want to redeem society, but not necessarily souls.

For one who accepts the Bible for what it says, these views are nothing but rank and unvarnished infidelity. Can any thing be more radical and false than to deny our historic religion? The virgin-birth and miracles of Christ? His redemptive death? His bodily resurrection (and consequently our resurrection)? Modern Liberalism has a wide influence in this religious world, and most old "respectable" denominations (or their institutions of Higher Learning, so-called) are captured by this pseudoism.

O Beloved! Beware of this modern unbelief. Get out of it and shun it like you would a rattlesnake! (II John 9-11).

#### CLOSING

Obviously we have not covered every phase of the origin of religious misunderstanding and false teaching. but at least we have called your attention to the problem. Most people close their eyes and say there is no problem. The majority are offended if you even imply there is something or someone wrong. We are told: "Go to the church of your choice; it doesn't make any difference what you believe, just so you are sincere" (However, examine II Thessalonians 2:10-12; Galatians 1:8). Beloved, in all honesty and sincerity, this is but naive and wistful thinking (or lack of thinking). The wish seems to be the father of the thought. An undesirable situation must be justified. excused, or recognized for what it is and corrected. Most people try to excuse and justify denominationalism.

The Lord Jesus forewarned (and may we listen): "And many false prophets shall rise, and shall deceive many. And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold. But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved" (Matthew 24:11-13). And the apostle Paul charged Timothy: "But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived. But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them; and that from a child thou hast known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus'' (II Timothy 3:13-15).

Beloved, the situation in the religious world today is not what Jesus wants. Would you search the Scriptures to find out for yourself just exactly what is taught and what Jesus wants? Atrue Christian's loyalty is to Christ, not to some man-made denominational system. Let us lay aside human names, creeds, and traditions (all by men). Yes, let us completely return to the church of the New Testament, which is not a denomination.

## WAS JESUS Bad?

IT IS HARD to believe that Jesus was bad. An eye-witness testified "He went about doing good and healing all that were oppressed by the devil" (Acts 10:38). The governor who yielded to mob pressure in ordering his crucifixion pleaded, "I am innocent of the blood of this just person' (Matthew 27:24). Even his worst enemies could come up with no substantial charge against him. Their best efforts are exemplified in the hateful insult, "Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?" (John 8:48). This would be like a prejudiced white man saying, "You must be a Negro and crazy."

On the contrary, men of all religions who have studied Jesus' life agree that he was one of the best men who ever lived. It is hard to fault a man who would voluntarily undergo crucifixion because of his compassion for sinners.

But if he was a good man, we cannot reasonably ignore his claims. He claimed, "I am the Son of God," (John 10:36), "I and the Father are one" (John 10:30), "Before Abraham was, I am" (John 8:58). Asked if he were the Messiah, he answered, "I am'' (Mark 14:62). He even said, "No one cometh to the Father, except by me" (John 14:6).

If he was a good man, his astound-

ing claims must be good, for a good man does not lie by making false

claims.

Some will say, "We cannot trust the New Testament that ever made such claims." In such a case, neither can we trust the New Testament that he was a good man. Since there is no other authentic account of his life, Jesus would be virtually a blank, about whom no one knows anything. But we have no justification for ruling out contemporary eve-witness accounts—now, 1900 years later, on subjective grounds alone.

'He was misled about himself, even though he was personally good in his conduct," some will say. In



the light of human nature, this would be hard to believe. Many self-deceivers have made extravagant claims: Herod, Nero, Diocletion, Hitler, Mao Tse-tung, to name a few. These have not been good men. On the contrary, it has been the most wicked men in history that have claimed deity, while men of character are known for humility. Bible heroes have been the humblest of men. This included Jesus' own disciples.

As a matter of fact, Jesus himself showed the ultimate humility: "The Son can do nothing of himself, but what he seeth the Father doing" (John 5:19). The other facet of this complete subjection to God is his perfect agreement or unity with the Father. It is in his humility that his glory is shown.

At any rate, a self-deceived megalomaniac who deluded thousands of people into conduct that needlessly cost them their lives (for Christians have died through persecution) could hardly be called "good." If he was good, then his claims must be valid.

If Jesus is a good man then, who made true claims, then everything he has said must be accepted as undiluted truth, for God does not lie. Some, strangely will say, "Jesus is the Son of God all right, but I can't accept everything he said." This would be like saying, "George is a man in whom I have complete confidence, but I don't believe what he says."

What Jesus said may indeed be quite contrary to our notions and desires. For example:

"If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me" (Matt. 16:24).

"He that loveth father or mother... son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me'' (Matthew 10:37).

"...fear him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell" (Matthew 10:28).

"Whosoever shall be ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of man shall be ashamed of him when he cometh in the glory of his Father with the holy angels" (Mark 8:38).

"Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to the whole creation. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that disbelieveth shall be condemned" (Mark 16:15, 16).

REGARDLESS of how Jesus' words might conflict with your thinking, if you believe he was a good man, you must surely believe too that he is the resurrected Son of God and that his words are true and authoritative. What have you done about them?

### "RATS AND RAGS"

QUESTION: What nation invests millions of dollars in research grants so scientists can try to show that the Genesis creation account is false? ANSWER: The United States of America, but we're not alone!

The Bible reveals that God created life through a supernatural process no longer in operation. Evolutionists insist that life was created by natural processes which still exist and can be studied today.

Every so often, a newspaper or magazine article announces with great excitement that a scientist somewhere has made a breakthrough in discovering how to create life. Supposedly, if a fleet of PhD's in modern laboratories with millions of government dollars can produce life, that will prove it happened by pure accident billions of years ago.

We need a clear look at these experiments to see how much or how little they prove. First of all, the chemical brews that are being called "life" today are not worth the name. Many factors prevent them from being legitimately "alive," but we will look at only one. A real cell has a membrane, an outer covering, holding it together. This is not present in man-made products. Two of the most celebrated concoctions, Dr. Oparin's coacervates, and Dr. Fox's miscrospheres, would have been redissolved and destroyed even if they had developed in a primitive environment. And these are merely the building blocks of life. Today's evolutionist cannot even produce a satisfactory biological "brick," let alone construct a functional "building."

Further, the small success that some researchers have had has been achieved under impossibly favorable conditions. The expectant scientists prepare laboratory environments, nurserylike, as friendly to the production of 'life' as possible. They nourish and cherish their little arrivals with motherly care. How does this prove anything about how life began accidentally under hostile conditions?

But perhaps a little sympathy for the evolutionist is in order here. He is wrestling with his most baffling puzzle when he tries to make a case for natural origin of life. He has captured the public imagination with his delightful sequence drawings, showing how a hairy, misshapen savage can develop into a gentleman with a briefcase, looking for all the world like your biology teacher. But the story of how inorganic things became living things by accident is the hardest to sell. It is impossible to prove. It is even difficult to imagine!

The Christian can be glad that he need not defend this grossly unscientific theory of origins. Men of the Middle Ages believed that rats grew from old rags, and frogs from lifeless mud. And the more true science advances, the less excuse there is for holding onto such benighted ideas.
