THE AWFULNESS OF SIN and It's Implications



I AM FEARFUL that very few of us really realize the awfulness of sin. This fact is seen when sinners fail to flee from the wrath to come when the gospel is preached. This is evident in the careless and faithless way that a lot of professed Christians live. We see it in their flirtation with the world, and then by them letting sin become their entertainment. How we see it when people are not conscious of a difference between the church and the world; yes, when we can live day-in and day-out with people of the world and never have a "burden" to mention Jesus to them.

And this is just the way the old devil would have it! He wants to sugar-coat sin, and make it look fascinating and fashionable; he wants righteousness and the standards of God to look old-fashioned, out of date. He wants you to think of sin not as something evil, or something awful, but as something very desirable. He is the great deceiver!

But we are continually warned: "BE NOT DECEIVED." "Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? BE NOT DECEIVED: neither formicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God" (I Corinthians 6:9, 10; Also, notice 15:32, 33; Galatians 6:7).

Beloved, sin is an awful thing! I am convinced that it is probably a thousand times more awful than the most sensitive of us has ever imagined.

1. THE AWFULNESS OF SIN IS SEEN IN THE FALL OF MAN.

Just think! One sin, a single disobedience, made the human race a dying race! That one sin had the most farreaching consequence. Adam and Eve, made after the image of God, were most favored by their Benevolent Creator in this Paradise on earth, Eden. And they had just one law. Having said they could freely eat of the trees of the Garden, God made one exception. They were prohibited to eat of the "tree of the knowledge of good and evil" in the midst of the Garden. God warned that they would "surely die" if they are of that forbidden fruit (Genesis 2:16,17). We know the sad story and the ensuing events. What tragedy! (an understatement). Later, removed by untold years and looking back, the apostle Paul wrote, "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned" (Romans 5:12).

Just think of the world's countless numbers whose mortal bodies have gone through this ordeal of death to return to corruption—all of humanity with two or three exceptions. And, too, directly or indirectly sin is the cause of all suffering and sorrow (through Adam or other-




INTRODUCING THE GOOD NEWS QUARTET

wise). Job, who endured many dreadful things, cried out, "If a man die, shall he live again?" (Job 14:14a). Paul testified in Romans 8:22, "For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now." Not only did man suffer a shameful fall, but it seems that nature itself was thrown into disarray and degeneration set in.

And all of this because of one sin! Oh, it staggers the imagination! Can anything be more awful? Beloved, don't treat sin lightly.

11. THE AWFULNESS OF SIN IS SEEN IN THE LAW OF MOSES.

The apostle Paul called the Law of Moses, "the law of sin and death" (Romans 8:2), and that is just exactly what it was. The Law of Moses was not God's final revelation to mankind, but it was given for a purpose. One of its purposes was to show the exceeding sinfulness of sin—just how awful sin is—so that man would really appreciate the Saviour when he came and so that man would know that he could not save himself by his own righteousness alone (Romans 3:19, 20); (Galatians 3:22-25). The wages of sin is death, all have sinned and come short of the glory of God, and all are under condemnation before God.

Paul had good reason for calling the Mosaic Law "the law of sin and death." Breaking that Law, in most cases, brought the swift penalty of death by stoning, "for the wages of sin is death." Let us illustrate.

Exodus 21:17 reads, "And he that curseth (to lightly esteem, vilify, revile) his father, or mother, shall surely be put to death." We further read, "If a man have a stubborn and rebellious son, which will not obey the voice of his father, or the voice of his mother, and that, when they have chastened him, will not hearken unto them: then... all the men of his city shall stone him with stones, that he die: so shalt thou put evil away from among you; and all Israel shall hear, and fear" (Deuteronomy 21:18-21). (What if this were practiced today in our age of unruly children and teenagers?)

Blasphemy and taking God's name in vain are also

most awful things as witnessed in the Law of Moses. A son of a certain Israelitish woman was heard to blaspheme the name of God, during the Wilderness journey. God's instructions were: "Bring forth him that cursed without the camp; and let all that heard him lay their hands upon his head, and let all the congregation stone him... And he that blasphemeth the name of the LORD, he snall surely be put to death, and all the congregation shall certainly stone him: as well the stranger, as he that is born in the land, when he blasphemeth the name of the LORD, shall be put to death" (Leviticus 24:10-16). Beloved, cursing is indeed an awful thing. If this law were enforced today, our population would be greatly decreased. God will not hold us guiltless by even calling His name lightly. To throw His name around in a non-religious, non-worshipping sense as to say, "O Lord!" is an awful thing to do.

When the Israelites broke the sabbath, what was the punishment? Stoning to death! (Numbers 15:32-36). This was also the case for those guilty of sexual immorality and adultery. The penalty for following false religion was death. And so the story goes for one sin right after the other—death!

Oh beloved, the conclusion is inescapable. God is trying to get a point across to our hardened hearts—sin is a most awful thing!

III. THE AWFULNESS OF SIN IS SEEN IN THE CROSS OF CALVARY.

Before we bring the scenes of Calvary before our minds, just think for a moment who Jesus really was anyway. The apostle John tells us that he pre-existed from eternity, and that there was not anything made without him making it (John 1:1-5; 17:5). Contemplate the vastness of the heavens, the things we see, and the things we don't see-he made all of this! Paul tells us that he is now "upholding all things by the word of his power" (Hebrews 1:3). Then, here is man, a little insignificant organic speck on this little island planet earth, who has sinned and "messed up" God's special arrangement for him. But this Almighty Creator, as it were, emptied himself of his deity to go through the process of human conception and birth in the person of Jesus, to experience life as a lowly mortal, and finally to suffer the worst humiliation and death imaginable at the hands of his creatures—all because of the awfulness of sin!

Paul speaks of the "offense of the cross" (Galatians 5:11). Death on a cross was a most shameful type of execution used by the Romans and reserved for the worst kind of criminals and slaves. It was not polite to mention it in decent society. The condemned ones were subjected to the most awful scourging and shameful maltreatment before the crucifixion took place. Men have actually died at this point before they were ever nailed to the cross. The cross was a cruel lingering type of death, men living up to a week as inflamation and unbelievable pain raked their whole bodies.

Such was the death that Jesus Christ, the mighty Creator, the sinless Son of God, and the altogether lovely One, experienced. Forsaken, suffering, and crying out in anguish, this awful ordeal was his. Why?! Because that sin is unbelievably awful. God loved fallen man, but God could not save man in his sins, sin being so awful. But in order to meet His sense of justice and mercy, in order to satisfy Himself, He suffered for us

in His Son.

Beloved, man's sins, our sins, are so awful that they nailed Jesus to the cross! Jesus died on that old rugged cross because of the difference between right and wrong.

1V. THE AWFULNESS OF SIN IS SEEN IN THE DAMNATION OF A LOST SOUL.

The Bible teaches the doctrine of heaven and hell. You can't accept one and deny the other, and still profess to be a Bible-believer. Jesus taught the reality of both places. In Matthew 25, after depicting that Great Day of Judgment, Jesus declared, "And these shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal" (Matthew 25:46). The word "everlasting" in reference to everlasting punishment, and the word "eternal" in reference to life eternal, are the same in the original language. If hell is not eternal, neither is heaven.

The apostle Paul shows what an awful place hell must be as he speaks of it in conjunction with the second coming of Christ—"In flaming fire taking vengeance on them that know not God, and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ: who shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of his power" (II Thessalonians 1:8,9). And, Jesus called hell (Greek: GEHENNA), "the fire that never shall be quenched." Then added, "Where the their worm dieth not, and the fire is not quenched" (Mark 9:43,44). He said there would be "weeping and gnashing of teeth."

When we die, that's it! "And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment" (Hebrews 9:27). As death finds you, so will the judgment. If you are not right with God when you die, you will never be. The book of Revelation pictures that final Day as having already come, and we read, "He that is unjust, let him be unjust still: and he which is filthy, let him be filthy still: and he that is righteous, let him be righteous still: and he that is holy, let him be holy still" (Revelation 22:11). When death has overtaken us, or the trump of the Lord has sounded, it will avail nothing to try to turn to God then. That's it! You've had it!

Oh, the tragedy of it! Oh, the finality of it! Doomed for ever to a devil's hell—and that is just what it is. Hell was originally prepared for the devil and his angels (Matthew 25:41). If we spend our lives for the devil, we can certainly expect to spend etemity with him.

Some may call God harsh and cruel, but we make the choice. Sin is an awful thing. It is more awful than we have ever thought. If we realized how awful it is, we would never question God and His wrath against sin and sinners.

IMPLICATIONS:

Yes, the awful fact is that sin is an awful thing, and the awfulness of sin has many far-reaching implications to us. Let us notice two of them.

1. It should make us really appreciate and love the Lord Jesus Christ.

We are a dying race through Adam. All of us have sinned and come short of the glory of God, and the wages of sin is death. We are under condemnation. The Law of Moses has proved to us that we cannot save ourselves by our own righteousness. The guilt of sin is still there,

and how great that guilt is! Even for one sin! We were hopelessly lost.

But we read such wonderful passages as these: "For he (God) hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him' (II Corinthians 5:21). "Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and the renewing of the Holy Ghost (Spirit)" (Titus 3:5). "Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in the time of need" (Hebrews 4:16).

Praise God for Jesus! Sin is just as awful as it ever was (make no mistake about it, Hebrews 2:1-3). But we have found freedom from the wrath of God through the love of God. The righteousness of the sinless Son of God is counted to be our righteousness when we repent and are baptized, turning to him. We are forgiven and justified because he died in our place. Our sins brought us under the condemnation of death, here and hereafter, but God has accepted the sinless sacrifice of Jesus in death in our place. Oh, how we love him, because he first loved us" (I John 4:19)!

Some flippantly talk about the love of God today, but they don't believe in the wrath of God. Sin is not so awful to them. But if we don't believe in the wrath of God, in the awfulness of sin, regardless of how much we may talk about the love of God, it is not going to mean very much to us. We will have a hard time appreciating it.

But how thankful we are for the Saviour! How we love him! We have been saved from the wrath to come.

It should make us really hate sin—think how awful sin is!

We know how awful sin is! At least we have tried to (Continued on Page 9)



 "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds; who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high; being made so much better than the angels, as he hath by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they." —HEBREWS 1:1-4

IF THERE IS any passage in the Bible that tells more about my friend Jesus than these verses, I don't know where it is. Yes, I call him my friend because, "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). It is easy to believe that Jesus walked on the water because the "heavens and the earth, which are now, by the same word are kept in store, reserved unto fire against the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men" (II Peter 3:7). It is easy to believe that the Bible you now have is the inspired Word written by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit in the first century because the King is upholding all things by the Word of his authority.

Man predicts an eclipse of the sun or the moon at such and such a time and place—with the aid of calculators and computers a total eclipse here, a certain percent there. Jesus makes it all happen. SPEAK, EXHORT, REBUKE (Titus 2:15)


• "These things speak, and exhort, and rebuke with all authority. Let no man despise thee."


AS AN EVANGELIST of the New Testament kind, Titus was on the island of Crete to set the churches in order (Titus 1:5). The New Testament evangelist has the authority inherent in the Word of God to get his job done. People are to respect and pay attention to what he says.


Notice what Titus was told to do is intensified with each additional word. "These things SPEAK, and EXHORT, and REBUKE with all authority." The word "SPEAK" is the general word. "EXHORT" is a little stronger word, involving not only teaching, but urging these truths upon them. The word "REBUKE" is the most intensified, having to do with convicting them of their faults (with the idea of shame); to correct them.

Thus, in this triplet of words the Holy Spirit shows us that God means business, and the evangelist is God's man to see that God's truth is obeyed. If the milder forms of instruction do not bring results, let the people know this is a very serious matter. Exhort. Rebuke. God's message is to be heeded by those who profess to be his followers.

Timothy received similar directions from the apostle Paul (I Tim. 4:11; II Timothy 4:1-5).







True Learning

• "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instruction."

-PROVERBS 1:7

AS A NATION, as a people, and as a school, we need God. All true knowledge and learning must be in the context of an awareness of God. If God created us, if He created all things, then He knows all things. He is the source of all knowledge. He made us after His own image. We are rational human beings. And, as we said, all true knowledge and learning must be in the context of an awareness of God. Even scientists, in all their discoveries, are merely thinking the thoughts of God after Him.

God made us, and the very purpose of our living should be to know and do His will. God forgets nations that forget Him. God respects nations that respect Him. "Righteousness exalteth a nation: but sin is a reproach to any people" (Proverbs 14:34). Righteousness exalts the nation that exalts righteousness. "The wicked shall be turned into hell, and all the nations that forget God" (Psalms 9:17).

This nation was founded on religious principles. In the early days of our country religion gave birth to our educational system. The first school teachers in the little one-room schools were the preachers. Children were taught how to read so they could read the Bible. Freedom of religion, as spoken of by our forefathers, did not mean freedom from religion. It meant the state would not become involved in the internal affairs of religious groups, and would not take a stand favoring any particular denomination. Every man would be free to exercise his own conscience in the matter of religion.

Again we say, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge..." (Proverbs 1:7). All true knowledge and learning must be in the context (or setting) of an awareness of God. Knowledge divorced from God is LIKE—

- -shooting a gun into the dark;
- -a running car with no one behind the wheel;
- -a clock with no hands on it!

get this point across. It brings destruction to our souls—here and hereafter. It is the ruination of mankind. That being the case, it should be the most detested and hated thing imaginable. And, if we truly come to love Jesus and righteousness, we will hate, yea, loathe, sin. There are two sides to this coin. One side says to love righteousness, and the other side says to hate sin. They go together. It is said of Christ, "Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity" (Psalms 45:7; Hebrews 1:9), and we are to be Christ-like. Paul wrote in Romans 12:9, "Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good." Jude used this imagery to make his point: "Hating even the garment spotted by the flesh" (Jude 23). How we should hate sin and its contaminating influence! Even the very appearance of evil. Sin, we know, is that had.

Oh, we are living in perilous times. The world is too much with us. So many professing Christians (and preach-

ers) don't really hate sin. They have compromised with the world (and you can see it in their lives and in their children). Someone's dirty joke, sin, becomes an occasion of laughter. Movies and television are so filled with sin and pollution, one way or another, that it is alarming to the spiritual mind. Jesus came to save us from sin, and if we hate it, how can we enjoy it being our entertainment (Romans 1:32; 8:6; Ephesians 5:11, 12)? Women dress immodestly (downright indecently) and make themselves up to look sexually alluring and suggestive—this is the style! Evil thoughts will send a man to hell, but who cares? (Matthew 5:28; I Timothy 2:9). It's quite obvious we don't hate sin today. Social drinking, dancing, smoking-you name it! Professed Christians don't hate sin, they don't realize how awful it is, or they would not engage in such sin-tainted things.

Beloved, we can't do wrong and get by. Sin is still as awful as it ever was in the sight of God. May we recognize it for what it is, abhor it, and cleanse ourselves of it. God has shown us grace and given us a chance. Let's come clean with God and forsake all sin (Titus 2:11-14; II Corinthians 6:14-7:1). Sin is an awful thing!

One Solution

YEARS AGO a young man knelt with a preacher and prayed as he committed himself to give a tenth of what he made to the Lord. His first week's pay was \$10, and the tenth was \$1. As he grew older he became more prosperous and his tenth was \$100 a week, then \$200, and then \$500. He sent his old friend a wire: "Come and see me."

The preacher arrived at the man's beautiful house. They had a good time talking over old times. Finally, the man came to his point: "You remember that promise I made years ago to give a tenth of all I made to the Lord? How can I be released from it?" he asked.

"It's like this," the man continued. "When I made that promise, I had only to give \$1, but now it is \$500. I can't afford to give away money like that."

The old preacher looked at his friend. "I'm afraid we cannot get a release from that promise, but there is something we can do. We can kneel here and ask God to shrink your income so you can afford to give one dollar."

and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one. And there are three that bear witness in earth, the Spirit, and the water, and the blood; and these three agree in one" (I John 5:5-8).

To believe that Jesus is the Son of God, to confess this belief before men, to change your mind about your sins and be baptized for the remission of your sins, and to live a life consecrated for Christ is the most right thing you can do (Matthew 16:16; Matthew 10:32; Acts 2:38; Revelation 2:7). Not to do this is the most unright thing you can do (Mark 16:16).

I can personally testify of a truth that Jesus will fulfill your life here in this world and in the next. If your will is not the same as God's will, you had better change your will.

There are three that bear record in heaven and three that bear witness in earth and they agree as one.

"In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth. And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters" (Genesis 1:1,2).

The same is true today. The Spirit of God moves on the face of the water. "Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost (Spirit)" (Acts 2:38). The Spirit, the water, and the blood and you all get together when you are buried beneath the water and rise to walk in the newness of life (Romans 6:4) because these three agree as one. "For if the blood of bulls and of goats, and the ashes of an heifer sprinkling the unclean, sanctifieth to the purifying of the flesh: How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?" (Hebrews 9:13,14).

Why not trust and obey? Yes, why not?

It is better for me to plead with you now while you can do this, than it is for you to be eternally lost and ask yourself why you didn't and not be able to.

A word about who has spoken; a word about who made the worlds; a word about the brightness of God's glory; a word about the exact image of the Father's person; a word about upholding all things; a word about "by himself he purged our sins;" and now a word about by inheritance Jesus obtained a more excellent name than the angels.

I am now working in a machine shop that is owned by a man named Kurt. He has a son named Bill. There are, of course, foremen and the rest of us. Kurt and Bill make the decisions and tell the foreman what they want. The foremen tell us and we try to fulfill the decisions.

The same thing is true spiritually. God the Father and His Son have spoken, Spirit-inspired men have spoken, and the Church obeys.

By way of example, let us say I walk in tomorrow and announce that every hourly wage earner is going to get fifty cents an hour raise. Who would believe it? Nobody! If the foremen did, we would expect it. If Bill did we we would know we would.

When Kurt dies, Bill by inheritance will receive the company. The foremen wouldn't, and neither will I. By inheritance Bill has a more excellent name than anyone but Kurt.

"Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip. For if the word spoken by angels was stedfast, and every transgression and disobedience received a just recompence of reward; how shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation; which at first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed unto us by them that heard him" (Hebrews 2:1-3).

IT MAY BE that you have been reading this paper and have never become a Christian. You have never accepted Jesus personally as your Saviour. 
