FAITHFULNESS in Obeying the Lord's Commands


It would be good for new Christians to read this article and others who may be having trouble living the Christian life. After all, the faithful Christian life is the more abundant life. After all, the crown of eternal life is only promised to those who remain faithful in obeying the Lord's commands (Revelation 2:10; 22:14).

1. THE BLESSEDNESS OF BEING FAITHFUL IN OBEYING THE LORD'S COMMANDS.

This is the testimony of the Scriptures. Revelation 22:14 reads, "Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and enter in through the gates into the city." As we know, this word "BLESSED" in the original language means to be happy or fortunate—even to the point of being envied by others. Certainly such is to be found in obeying the Lord's commands. Have you ever thought why a hypocrite plays the part of a hypocrite? The answer is rather simple. He is a hypocrite because he knows that that which he is pretending to be like, and is not, is better than what he is. The good way of life is better than his way of life. Proverbs 11:19 should be remembered as a principle that always holds true. Note: "As righteousness tendeth to life: so he that pursueth evil pursueth it to his own death."

And, truly, being faithful in keeping the Lord's commands brings a blessedness that is not to be found anywhere else. This is the testimony of the "beatitudes" in the first part of the "Sermon on the Mount" spoken by our Lord (Matthew 5:1-12). If you notice the word "BLESSED" is found time and time again here. We have already given its definition.

He starts out by saying, "BLESSED are the poor in



spirit: for their's is the kingdom of heaven." then continues, "BLESSED are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted. BLESSED are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth." Please keep in mind these "beatitudes" are given, it seems, in progressive, graduated steps. He starts out at the starting place, being "poor in spirit." By this he means that we must get to the place where we see our own spiritual bankruptcy and unworthiness before God before we can proceed any further before God. The person who comes face to face with himself (and God) is a good candidate to find true happiness. "BLESS-ED are they that mourn" follows logically. When we see and recognize our spiritual bankruptcy, it should produce godly sorrow. We will bemoan our condition and situation. The next "beatitude" is a natural off-shot from this one-"BLESSED are the meek." Recognizing our unworthiness. and bemoaning it, will change our attitude toward others.



AN UNEXPECTED TRIP TO BIBLE LANDS-NO. II

THE PLACES TOURED

IT MIGHT be of interest for me to summarize the main places visited in the Bible lands tour that I unexpectedly took this early spring.

Our tour of Rome was short, which included stopping at the Coliseum and St. Peter's Basilica (at the Vatican). besides see ing many noteworthy things in passing.

We came in contact with so much in Israel that it would be hard to tell you about it all, for about every foot of that land is packed full of Bible-related happenings. I will list some of the places visited (but not all of them): Jerusalem, Sychar, Samaria, Megiddo, Nazareth, Tiberias, Caesarea Philippi, Capernaum, Sea of Galilee, Bethshan, Acre. Mt. Carmel, Caesarea, Joppa, Ashkelon, Bethany, Jericho, Dead Sea, Qumran, Massada, Hebron, Bethlehem, Mt. of Olives, etc., etc.

In the days spent in Greece we visited Athens (the acropolis), Delphi, and Corinth. All of this proved very interesting, informative, and worthwhile.

We did not visit Egypt on this tour, which I very much regret. There are plans in the making to go on a similar

We will not be arrogant—we will be meek.

In the midst of these "BLESSEDS" this "beatitude" now appears. "BLESSED are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled." May we, may the whole world, realize this truth! Happiness is not attained by seeking after happiness. It comes as a by-product of seeking after righteousness; being right with God, keeping His commands. True happiness will be forever a fleeting, elusive thing to the world (both now and hereafter).

Next we read, "BLESSED are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy. BLESSED are the pure in heart: for they shall see God. BLESSED are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God." These are logical and appropriate statements to follow what has already been said. We have found mercy in turning to God, and we will show it in our dealing with others. We have become pure in heart, and singleness of heart characterizes our life. Being at peace with God, it is natural that we will be a peacemaker among our fellowmen. All of these things make for happiness.

Finally we read, "BLESSED are they which are persecuted for righteousness sake: for their's is the kingdom of heaven. BLESSED are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. REJOICE, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you." When we have attained the righteousness the Lord is talking about in this Sermon on the Mount, we will be persecuted. The key verse to this Sermon is Matthew 5:20, saying that our righteousness must exceed that of the scribes and Pharisees before we can enter the kingdom. When we attain this righteousness, the world will hate us, but we will be happy people. This righteousness is found in Jesus and in keeping his commands.

There are many other Scriptures we could point out that show the blessedness in keeping the Lord's commands. Paul testified that "godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come" (I Timothy 4:8). We get a double-barrel shot at this blessed state to be found in our religion. Such Scriptures as Romans 14:17, Philippians, and Romans 8:28 are very impressive.

But there is another side to this: The blessedness of being faithful in obeying the Lord's commands is seen by taking a look at those who do not obey these commands. Remember Proverbs 11:19. "As righteousness tendeth to life: sohe that pursueth evil pursueth it to his own death."

This writer could tell you of multiplied cases from real life, from personal experience and observation, but it would be much too personal. These people who have disregarded the unchanging principles of right and wrong have done so to their own hurt and sorrow (even now and surely hereafter). We could tell you of the heartaches of broken homes, of bruised and battered lives, all because people have carelessly disregarded what the Bible teaches concerning fidelity in marriage. We could tell you of people who would like to do right, but seemingly can't because they have so destroyed themselves with strong

drink and drugs they have lost control of themselves. We could tell you of people behind bars in prison because they have broken the laws of man and of God.

Even in this life many times the consequences of sin are reaped. Hebrews 11:25 tells us that Moses forsook Egypt rather "than enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season." And that is the story of sin. For a while there is pleasure in sin, but it usually is short-lived. Sooner or later we will find that sin has the sting of death in in. Even in this life we can discover that "the way of the transgressors is hard." Regardless, "the wages of sin is death." And "it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment" (Hebrews 9:27). We may think that our sins haven't caught up with us, as we are so busy living a "fast" life. But in death and the judgment we will come to a grinding halt, and every sin that we have ever committed will come sliding in an ugly heap upon top of us to testify against us. Hell is the only place we can go if our sins have never been forgiven.

Yes, in summing it up, let us say that Jesus and Satan typify the blessedness (either way you look at it) in keeping God's commands. The angel told Joseph, having reference to Mary, "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shall call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins" (Matthew 1:21). The name "Jesus" means saviour, and the message about Jesus is called the gospel, meaning the good news. But in sharp contrast with this, the name "Satan" means enemy, and "Devil" denotes a slanderer-one who speaks against us. So, on the one hand we have the good news of the one who wants to save us, and on the other we have one who is our enemy and slanders us. He wishes to destroy us. To serve Jesus is a blessed state because of the relationship we have entered and because of that which we have left and avoided. Either way you look at it, the blessedness of being found faithful is emphatically emphasized.

II. THE SECRET OF BEING FAITHFUL IN OBEYING THE LORD'S COMMANDS.

The Secret of being found faithful in obeying the Lord's commands is to realize we can't be faithful. (Please read on and take what is said in its context).

This is the story of the Bible—the unfaithfulness of man. We classify Bible history under three main periods: namely, the Patriarchal, the Mosaical, and the Christian ages. What characterized each period? During the Patriarchal age, when God dealt with the heads of the tribe or family, they had no written law. With the coming of the Mosaical age God gave an involved set of laws and commandments to Moses for the Israelite people. Now we are living in the Christian age, an age not without law, but characterized by grace. God's revelation has been in progressive stages (periods or ages), and each one got a point across to mankind in retrospect. Whether with or without law, man still missed the mark in pleasing God. The bringing in of the Christian age was designed to solve man's problem.

Any way you look at it, all have sinned and come short of God's glory (Rom. 3:23). Paul called the O.T. system (Mosaical) the law of sin and death. It seems it was calculated to show the exceeding sinfulness of sin—just how awful

tour in the spring of 1977, which will include Egypt. Remember that. Perhaps you would like to go on this "tour of a lifetime." More will be said about that later.

SMALL, RUGGED, AND ROCKY

The land of Palestine proved to be just like I thought it would be—only more so (if that makes sense). I knew that Israel was a small country. I was well aware that it was rugged, rocky, and mountainous (I thought). But there is something about being there that impresses these facts upon you in an unforgetable way that never could be experienced by just reading a book.

The extent at one time of the ancient kingdom of Israel was from "Dan to Beer-sheba." I would think that in these modern times a person could drive this distance in one day, then have several hours to spare (even with the terrain being rugged). Really, this land comprises an area no larger than two or three counties in the state (N. C.) and part of the country (U. S. A.) in which this writer lives.


Around Jerusalem the land seemed to be especially rugged as well as being arid. Rocks, small and great, protruded from the ground like the bleached bones of a dead man's dehydrated body. Much of the plumbing could be seen on top of the ground (around the city of Jerusalem) because there was not enough soil to bury it. Walking across the endless heaps of rocks in the Judean wilderness near the Dead Sea made me very sympathetic toward the children of Israel wandering for about forty years in such a setting. It is a good thing God made it

The first thought that came to my mind was I Corinthians 1:27-29, which reads, "For God hath chosen the foolish things of the world to confound the wise; and God hath chosen the weak things of the world to confound the things that are mighty; And base things of the world and things which are despised, hath God chosen, yea, and things which are not, to bring to nought things that are: That no flesh should glory in his presence." The All-Mighty God of Heaven has an uncanny way of communicating with man, and behind it all is the design to discourage pride in His fallen off-spring —"That no flesh should glory in his presence." Whether it be the little nation of Israel, or the old rugged cross, the purpose would seem to be the same.

Then other thoughts come to mind. The eastern shores of the Mediterranean have been the crossroads of the civilized world from the most ancient of times. The way things developed it would seem that God was setting the stage. Perhaps this is implied when Paul wrote, "But when the FULNESS OF THE TIME was come. God sent

Like Moses of old, many people know that sin's pleasures are but for a season (Hebrews 11:25), that the world will pass away and the lusts thereof (I John 2:16,17). Some day when these things have passed away and they are faced with eternity, they will cry out against sin and accuse it. But it will be too late. Sin will reply, "You knew I was but for a season. Don't blame me." And, truly, one cannot blame sin with the warning of God being what it is.

The Bible says that the wages of sin is death (Romans 6:23). This death is eternal separation from God throughout eternity. Hear it expressed in II Thessalonians 1:9, "WHO SHALL BE PUNISHED with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of his power." Imagine what it is going to be like in hell: people blaming sin for the death which is their wages for having served sin. Can't you hear them saying, "How could you do this to me?"

sin really is in the sight of God. When they broke this law, the immediate penalty was usually death. If a person reviled his father or mother, he was to be put to death (Leviticus 20:10). A person guilty of adultery was to be put to death (Leviticus 20:10). For blasphemy, or cursing, the penalty was death (Leviticus 24:10-16). And so on we could reiterate. Writing about this Law of Moses, Paul said, "Cursed is every one that continueth not in all things which are written in the book of the law to do them" (Galatians 3:10). In other words, to be justified by the Law a person would have to keep in perfectly. Just one sin would undo all our supposed righteousness attained by Law-keeping. Even in the Carden of Eden, one sin made the human race a dying race. Paul argues that no man has ever been justified by the Law (Galatians 3:11). "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). The truth of the matter is that man cannot be faithful enough (total, complete) to be saved in keeping God's commands by himself! Jesus even said, "So likewise ve. when ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, We are unprofitable servants..." (Luke 17:10).

Thus it was proved to man that he needed a solution to his predicament, and that solution was soon to come in the form of the Saviour. In the early history of mankind God instituted animal sacrifice. Man committed sin and should have died right there on the spot, "for the wages of sin is death." However, in a symbolic way God let man kill an animal, and the animal took the place of man in death. The "life of the flesh" is in the blood, and when the animal's blood was shed, the life of the animal took the place of man's life in death (Leviticus 17:11). But, really, the animal sacrifice could never take away sin. Each sacrifice in the Patriarchal and Mosaical age was merely a symbolic prophecy pointing to the sinless Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. During the Old Testament, the animal sacrifice was more of a symbol of guilt than of forgiveness. Hebrews 10:1-4 reads, "For the law having a shadow of good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with those sacrifices which they offered year by year continually make the comers thereunto perfect. For then would they not have ceased to be offered? because that the worshippers once purged should have had no more conscience of sins. But in those sacrifices there is a remembrance again made of sins every year. For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats should take away sins." If the sins were forgiven during the year, and in times past, why was another sacrifice made for them at the Passover? But, now, since Jesus has come and made that supreme and final sacrifice in his sinless self, we read, "And their sins and iniquities will I remember no more" (Hebrews 10:17). "For He (God, the Father) hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him' (II Corinthians 5:21). How wonderful! We could not keep the commands of the Lord perfectly, but there has been ONE who has! Through him all past sins are absolved, never to be held against us again. "For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through him might

be saved" (John 3:17). We were already under condemnation (all of us—lost!), but he has brought salvation. Praise the Lord! "Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and the renewing of the Holy Spirit" (Titus 3:5). "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is no other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved" (Acts 4:12).

Also, the secret of being faithful in obeying the Lord's commands is found in the very nature of the New Testament itself. Remember, Jesus came to save us not to condemn us.

The New Testament starts with the new birth and a new person. Jesus told Nicodemus, "Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3,5). The writer of Hebrews, quoting from Jeremiah, hinted about this new covenant and new relationship to God (Hebrews 8:7-12). He wrote, "For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, saith the Lord; I will put my laws in their mind, and write them in their hearts: and I will be to them a God, and they shall be to me a people... and their sins and their iniquities will I remember no more." The Old Testament law engraved on stones was handed to a man externally, and he was commanded to keep it-he failed. The New Testament works just the opposite: it starts on the inside of man and works out to accomplish its purpose. The inside of man is cleaned up first. New Testament commands are to be obeyed by people who have experienced the new birth and are now new creatures in

The Bible



forth his Son..." (Galatians 4:4). When Jesus came into the world, the Mediterranean world, and much of the rest, was under Roman rule. Roman roads traversed this world. Wars were at a minimum. One language was almost universally understood. All made for the rapid spread of the gospel. (Also, mankind had demonstrated by hard experience that man could not save himself by philosophy, by law, or natural religion—the times were full; man was in need of something better). All of this gives us some hint as to why God chose the land of Israel for the point of contact with this world.



HAS THERE BEEN any same sex marriages in your community yet? Don't say it can't happen because if your state has passed the Equal Rights Amendment then there will be. As of this writing, one county in Colorado has issued six licenses to homosexuals and lesbians. Alocal judge ruled that these were legal under the E.R.A.

Most of us voted in ignorance on this bill, never dreaming that it would bring this. But, let's not remain in the dark! This bill is dangerous. It is "anti-God" and "anti-Bible" in its applications.

One of Colorado's Legislators who is seeking to change our state marriage laws so as to make it illegal for people of the same sex to marry, said he never thought such a law would be necessary. He was surprised that our morals had slipped so low. But, we need to remember, if the E.R.A. is passed, it will become a federal law, and it will strike down all state laws that are contrary to it. This means that if a state has a law forbidding same sex marriages, that law will become unconstitutional.

Some of those so married in Colorado are seeking to adopt children. They are challenging our adoption laws which discriminate against same sex marriages. If the E.R.A. is passed there will be many such laws declared unconstitutional. You see the Equal Rights Amendment is a Constitutional Amendment!

Every law that speaks in terms of "men" and "women," "husbands" and "wives," or "male" and "female" will have to be rewritten to read "persons." It will then be legal for "persons" to get married, to adopt children, to be drafted into the military, etc.

I get the impression that some people don't believe that the Feminist really wants total equality. Think again! Here is a little history of the movement. Betty Fredan in 1966 formed and became the first president of N.O.W. (National Organization for Women). Soon the organization was divided into 45 feminist organizations in the United States. Some of the more militant groups are "The Red

Stockings," "Bread and Roses," "SCUM" (A Society for Cutting Up Men), and "The Witch Women." These militant groups are trained in guerrila warfare. They believe in the violent overthrow of our society.

N.O.W., though not as militant, is the largest and most influential of all the feminist organizations. Recently, the local chapter of N.O.W. met in our area. To announce their meeting they sent the following letter to the editor of our town paper: "Dear Ms. ________, I would like to submit the following announcement of our general meeting. The next meeting of the Ft. Collins chapter of the National Organization of Women will be held Wednesday, April 2, at the Methodist Church, 1005 Stover Street, beginning at 7:30 p. m. Following the general business meeting, this months program will be presented by the Sexuality and Lesbianism Task Force and will consist of skits, slides, and dialogue on the topic 'Perceptions and Experiences of Gay Women.' Everyone is encouraged to attend." The letter was signed by the local secretary.

At this meeting the following Resolution from the national organization was read and discussed. Keep in mind two things as you read this: (1) The Bible condemns Lesbianism, Romans 2:26,27, and (2) This is the organization promoting E.R.A.

N.O.W. RESOLUTION 128 - PASSED, 5th ANNUAL CONFER-ENCE, SEPTERMBER 1971

"Whereas, the first wave of feminist anger in this country recognized the fundamental issue of women's liberation as 'the most sacred right of all, a woman's right to her own person.' This is the right that N.O.W. reaffirmed a century later when it took up the banner and dedicated itself to changing those contradictions in society, the laws, the practices, the attitudes, that prevented women from realizing their full human potential. Recognizing that a woman cannot control her own body. N.O.W. has demanded the dissemination of birth control information and contraceptives and repeal of all laws against abortion. It has stopped short, however, of clarifying its position on every woman's right to define, and express, her own sexuality, to choose her own life style. Specifically, N.O.W. has been silent on the issue of lesbianism. Yet no other woman suffers more abuse and discrimination for the right to be her own person than does the lesbian, and

"Whereas, the lesbian is doubly oppressed, both as a woman and as a homosexual, she must face the injustices and degradation common to all women, plus endure additional social, economic, legal, and psychological abuse as well. In education and employment, the lesbian confronts more than discrimination or tokenism. She can be arbitrarily rejected or dismissed from many professions. even those, such as teaching, traditionally relegated to women. Married women are denied equality under laws that decree men as head of the household, but a wife is nonetheless allowed some legal protection. A lesbian, however, who shares her home with another woman, regardless of her income or responsibilities, foregoes all the economic and legal compensations granted to the married woman, including tax deductions, insurance, benefits, inheritance rights, etc., and

"Whereas, most divorced women are conceded the (Continued on Page 8)

right to their children, a lesbian is automatically presumed unfit for motherhood, and can have her children taken from her, and

"Whereas, these are but a few of the laws and practices in our society that reflect irrational assumptions about lesbians. Just as the false and demeaning image of all women provides the rationale to keep them subjugated, so does the distorted stereotype of the lesbian sanction her persecution. Not only is she assumed to be unstable or sick or immoral; but because she defines herself independently of men, the lesbian is considered unnatural, incomplete, not quite woman, as though the essence of womanhood were to be identified with men. Obviously, this Playboy image of the lesbian reduces her to an abject sexual object, deprived of the most basic civil and human rights due every person, and

"Whereas, because she is so oppressed and so exploited...Lesbians became active in N.O.W. and in other groups, fighting for all the feminist goals, including child care centers and abortion repeal. As a result of their activism in the movement, lesbians, as did all feminists, reached a new consciousness, a new sense of their worth and dignity as women and human beings.

"... Whereas, lesbians were never excluded from N. O.W. but we have been evasive or apologetic about their presence within the organization. Afraid of alienating public support, we have often treated lesbians as stepsisters of the movement, allowed to work with us, but then expected to hide in the upstairs closet when company comes...this discrimination is inconsistent with N.O.W.'s stated goal to 'recognize our sisterhood' and to help women 'overcome self-degredation.' If this pledge is to be anything more than idle rhetoric, N.O.W. must reassess the priorities that sacrifice principles to 'image'...If lesbians are women, and if lesbians suffer discrimination and deprivation, then the conclusion is inescapable: their oppression is not only relevant, but an integral part of the women's liberation movement.

"Whereas, the resolution... is an action, the first step towards breaking down the barriers between women that have kept them weak and suppressed. We are giving notice that we recognize our sisterhood with all women and that we are fighting for every woman's 'sacred right to her own person.' As feminists, we can do no less;

"Therefore be it resolved: That N.O.W. recognize the oppression of women who are lesbians, and

"Be it further resolved: That a woman's right to her own person includes the right to define and express her own sexuality and to choose her own lifestyle, and

"Be it further resolved: That N.O.W. acknowledge the oppression of lesbians as a legitmate concern of feminism."

The feminists seem to stand for everything that is contrary to God and the Bible. If all the laws are passed that this group is striving for, no one would have the right to live as the Bible dictates. The E.R.A. will open the door for every lesbian, every homosexual, and every pervert to walk through. Several years ago the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah were destroyed by fire from God be-

cause they were wholly given over to these unnatural lusts. Can we sit back and not do anything about this amendment?

The homosexual is one sinner the Bible says that God gives up on (Romans 1:26,27). Should we not fight to get rid of this amendment that will promote homosexuality? These people need to come out of their sin, instead of enacting laws to encourage it.

The proponents of E.R.A. have some strange bedpartners. In March of this year, the Governing Board of the National Council of Churches...in the USA (NCC) met in Chicago. Among other things, they discussed Women's Liberation, Lesbianism and the E.R.A. The Board adopted unanimously the E.R.A. resolution and they urged member churches to work for its ratification in the states.

Under the heading of Women's Liberation the Board set up a "Division of Education and Ministry." This "task force" was to study sexism in the Bible, and prepare materials for a Bible translation and the rewriting of some Bible stories from a woman's point of view.


The Board also adopted a resolution supporting the rights of members and pastors to freely express their sexual preferences. In other words, a homosexual was not to be discriminated against.

Both the NCC and NOW have completely ignored God and the Bible on this subject. But God will not be mocked, someday every knee will bow before Him.

There is a lot of talk about our "rights." But we never have the right to sin. The Bible doesn't speak about our "rights," it speaks about our "responsibilities" and "duties." Any nation that will follow the Bible will be exalted. God has promised (Proverbs 14:34).

God has so created the woman that she is to find her completeness in the man. (ALSO THE MAN FINDS HIS COMPLETENESS IN THE WOMAN—Editor). She was made as a "help meet for him" (Genesis 2:18). DEAD BODIES provide much of the material that scholars interpret about earth's history.

These preserved bodies make up the fossil record, a history book without words, a collection of clues about living things from long ago, and conditions under which they lived and died.

But as fasinating and promising as the fossil record is, there is disagreement on how it should be interpreted. The two basic views of life's origin and development are Creation and Evolution. Supporters of each theory believe the fossil record provides them with evidence.

FOSSILS AND EVOLUTION

Scientists have noticed a general tendency for smaller, less complex fossils to be found in lower layers of sedimentary rocks, and larger, complicated fossils to appear in higher layers (There are many exceptions to this rule, I understand—Editor). Since evolutionists believe the rock layers were formed over vast stretches of time, they conclude that fossils reflect a gradual process of change from simple to complex forms.

Of course, evolutionists have always recognized that if the fossils are supposed to retell the story of evolution, some large and important chapters are absent. Missing transitional forms, or "links," have puzzled some scientists for over a century. Darwin himself acknowledged this problem, but was sure that continued investigation would turn up these missing fossils. Unfortunately for his theory, the same basic gaps are still there, a hundred years later.

FOSSILS AND CREATION

Scientists who believe in special creation are convinced that fossils tell a two-part story of earth history. The first chapter is a sudden creation of distinct plant and animal kinds that reproduced further generations similar to themselves. The second chapter is a sudden global catastrophe, a flood accompanied by other powerful forces such as earthquakes.

How do the fossils speak of sudden creation? Primarily through the absence of real fossils from the lowest (Pre-Cambrian) rock layer, and the abrupt appearance of an abundant variety of life in the Cambrian layer. How do the fossils speak of reproduction of generations always similar to their ancestors? Primarily through the absence of linking forms that we would expect between one sort

of animal and another if they had evolved. For example, if flight evolved in some animals, where are the fossil forms of animals with half-developed wings?

Finally, what fossil evidence exists for a world-wide flood? First of all, the very presence of fossils means that something unusual, powerful, and sudden happened. Natural death and decay processes do not produce fossils, they only produce enriched soil. Only under cirsumstances of rapid burial, intense pressure, and other abnormal conditions will a body escape decay long enough to fossilize. Second, the rocks themselves are best accounted for in flood terms. The layers are sedimentary, formed from muds deposited by moving water. The ebbing and flowing of receding flood waters described in Genesis could lay down the whole geologic column in a short time. Water action and other flood factors would also tend to sort smaller, less complex organisms toward the bottom first.

WHAT THE EVIDENCE MEANS

The fossils, and many other lines of scientific evidence, point powerfully to a special supernatural creation, and should influence honest inquirers to reconsider, if necessary, the Bible's view of life's origins. But what does it matter, other than merely shedding some light on a long-standing debate among scientists?

It matters, because the fact of a Creator and the fact of a written message (the Bible) from Him add up to human responsibility. It is exactly this responsibility that men have sought to escape. The most attractive escape route has been rejection of the Creator, and insistence that the creation created itself. To abandon the myth of evolution, then, is to face the reality of God, and of every person's responsibility to serve and obey Him.

Most important, the Creator literally became a man about two thousand years ago. One of his biographers wrote, "All things were made by him... He came unto his own, and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them he gave power to become the sons of God..." (John 1:3, 11, 12). Since then, millions have found these claims so persuasive that they have followed Christ, their Creator, whole-heartedly. Millions more have found these claims so unsettling that they have worked overtime trying to prove that "all things were NOT made by him, or by anyone."

But dead bodies, fossilized historians, speak conclusively against this system of unbelief.

Christ Jesus. The New Testament is not the law of sin and death, but the perfect law of liberty; it is the law of the Spirit of life. Read Romans 8:1-4.

If we are lost, it will be in spite of what God has done and is doing. We are not perfect, but we have entered into a vital and living relationship with ONE who is perfect. Not only did Jesus die for us, he is now our great high priest in heaven, interceding on our behalf. Listen and heed this wonderful Scripture: "Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens. Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our profession. 
Quickening "QUOTES"


